We have received "Makerspace" designation from software supplier, Vectric Co. (http://www.Vectric.com) for a yearly contract of \$99. This permits many members to design CNC projects without the need of each member having to expend monies for the software. A rough draft of the operating procedures and proposed course work is now undergoing final testing.

The Toy Department a busy start to 2018.

We participated in three external community activities:

- Toys on the Square at Lake Sumter Landing on January 11th, which was a rain shortened event when collected only \$118.00 in sales and donations.
- Colonial Days at Brownwood on January 19th which was a cool but dry day and we had a better day collecting \$618.00 in sales and donations.
- Hoedown Days at the Polo Field on January 27th where we assembled almost 250 pocket cars and totes in the Kids Korner. We also collected donations of \$175.00.

My thanks to all the Toy Team members who donated their time and efforts to these activities.

Our Toy production activities also started back up in earnest in January. We produced 836 Toys (which included 150 Pocket cars and 100 Totes for Hoedown Days) compared to 436 produced last January.

There were no client shipments in January. We will start those in earnest in February. We will be focusing on our commitment to the Children's Home society of Florida.

We will be back to Lake Sumter Landing on February 15th for Toys on the Square from 5-8:30pm. Our Toys on the Square will move to Spanish Springs town square in March for our Spring season.

Our records show that we currently have 884 members and 28 volunteers which means that we lost about 73 members as the year changed; however, we welcomed 130 new members in 2017 which puts our 2018 base number about 57 above the January base number of last year. **Additionally we have over 60 names on the waiting list.** The Board will review the status at the March meeting to decide whether to open membership up to a finite number.

The IT committee has tested the electronic key system on one of the side doors with success. They are in the process of ordering a duplicate system for the other side door. When installed, these systems will allow a person to check-in through the side doors, but not check out. When a person keys in his/her ID number, the system will check our database to see if that number is a legitimate member and unlock the door. If a person goes out to the parking lot and returns through the same door, the system will do the same checking as before and unlock the door again. Checking out will only happen at the front desk.

Under the leadership of Nancy Blackmore we made \$1,259.68 at Colonial Days! Thank you, Nancy!

Our second year in the Kids Zone of Hoe Down Days was very successful too (as reported by Conway)!

The Club has also opened up the opportunity for Village residents who are veterans to obtain an urn at the cost of a donation. This will actually "kick-off" in March. We are putting in place the requirements (e.g. proof of service etc.) and a system to aid in not allowing this opportunity to be abused.
