- Anyone can sign up for you in your place IF they have ALL of your info.
- Cash or check to VWC only. No Credit. No refunds. Choose carefully!
- There is a 2 Course limit for the first 2 weeks to be fair to others behind you.
- You can sign up for your 3rd course this term starting on Monday, January 20th.
- More classes will be added as Instructors become available (Please!) or add classes.

Most common errors that cause some frustration

- Arriving cranky LOL!!! Be patient; there may be a line
- Not allowing enough time; Arrive before 3 pm; It's not as fast as grocery check out
- Forgetting to check your 'Social Director' for travel, event, family, etc. date conflicts
- Forgetting to check to see if you have the required Prerequisites or skills needed to be successful
- Signing up for courses that are too hard for your current skill level
- Not reading Course Descriptions beforehand to make sure you're enrolling in the one you really want
- Not checking for alternates in case your initial choices are already full
- Not having your calendar in your hand when you sign up in case changes occur
- Not having cash or a blank check or your Village ID #
- Waiting too long to sign up; Classes have 'Enroll BEFORE' dates; exceptions are difficult
- Expecting the Front Desk person (or the "Computer") to make exceptions/fixes just for you

The VWC Toy Department had our most successful year ever!

Since our last report we continue to have a very busy and productive year. The elves and painters continue their hard work!

- They had produced 8,821 toys through the end of October, since that report they have added:
 - In November another 792 Toys were made.
 - At the end of November that gave us 9,915 toys produced, which is 1,283 Toys ahead of last years' record pace.
 - So far in December we have added an additional 436 toys, which gives 10,351 already completed for the year.
- On the shipping side we are also making excellent progress.
 - At the end of October we had 7,966 toys shipped, with a donation value of \$58,192.00!
 - $\circ~$ In November we shipped an additional 790 toys.
 - So far in December we have shipped 1,241 toys, and an additional 155 toys already to go out by the end of next week.
 - When those are completed we will have shipped **10,152** toys with a donation value of **\$78,467.00**!

At this time of the year I think it is appropriate to look back and see where we've come from and to thank all of those people who contributed to our success along the way. A group of woodworkers decided that there was a need for wooden toys for children in 2001. They went from garage to garage and kitchen table to kitchen table to make paint, assemble and donate 142 toys that first year. That group was instrumental in convincing the Developer to build our current shop in 2004. That group produced about 500 toys that year. Fast forward to the end of 2019 and the VWC and its' Toy Department has now produced over 85,000 wooden toys for the needy children in the Tri County area.

I would like to recognize Ron Gammon for his continued service to the Toy Department and the greater VWC organization over all these years.

I would also like to take this opportunity to wish all of the members of the Toy Team and the VWC and their families a Merry Christmas and healthy and a very Happy Year.
